1.	Roll Call	The chair conducted a roll call and called the meeting to order at 9:05 a.m.
2.	Identification of conflicts of interest	No conflicts of interest were noted.
3.	Discussion: Approval of funding provision to continue work on the Ice Facility	Board approval was being sought for expenditures to continue the planning and fundraising campaign for the ice facility until December 2016. The ice facility would represent a small but highly visible part of the total capital investment in the student experience and community engagement over the next ten years. This is a new build project, rather than renewal of the existing rink, only because it is not feasible to renew Rutherford Rink. The Board approved the provision of funding for expenditures to continue work on the Ice Facility to December 31, 2016.
4.	Other business	President Stoicheff provided an update to the Board on the search for a provost and vice-president academic.
