Notably, the acquisition of a 360-degree video machine stands out as a versatile investment. Not only can it be utilized for various GSA functions, but it also presents an opportunity for rental, potentially generating additional income for the organization.

In addition to financial matters, the GSA has been actively engaged in filling several key positions, including hiring, award, and other committees. These appointments are crucial on our campus and having graduate student representation is vital in ensuring the intersectional and interdisciplinary operations of our communities.

Moreover, we are committed to fostering inclusivity and democracy within the GSA. To this end, we have opened our elections processes, inviting all graduate students to step forward and lead the change they wish to see.
